

GED Testing

What are the GED Tests?

The GED is a credential offered to adults who did not finish high school. There are 5 subject area tests in social studies, science, literature, math and writing that lead to a General Equivalency Development Certificate. A minimum score (410) is required in each subject area and an average overall score of 450 to receive the GED.

Who can take the GED exam?

Individuals, 19 years and older, who have not completed high school are eligible. Individuals under the age of 19 may not be currently enrolled in high school and must have a release from the school district where they are currently living.

When is the exam given?

Our GED Testing Center has day and evening appointments. Attending a pre-registration/orientation session is mandatory before scheduling to take any of the GED tests. Check the college website for the quarterly testing schedule (www.cptc.edu) or call 235-589-6045 or 253-589-5760.

How much does the test cost?

The 5 tests cost \$75 or each test is \$15.

How do I prepare for the GED exam?

You can enroll in GED preparation classes. To find out about GED classes at Clover Park call 589-5760 or stop by Bldg 26P. Libraries and bookstores also carry GED study guides.

How do I get started?

Attend a pre-registration/orientation session. Pay for the tests you are going to take. Schedule the tests.
