75th Anniversary Gala

The 75th Anniversary Gala held on May 19 was successful in raising over \$87,000 for Student Emergency Grants. It was a chance to re-connect with some former trustees, faculty, staff, and President Sharon McGavick. An anonymous donor sponsored the dessert dash, the Pastry Arts Program created 30 cakes that were designed to represent programs, it was quite competitive and fun, and raised almost \$9,000. Budget Update

Mr. Clark said the FY2018-19 Budget is close to being completed and will be ready for approval at the July 2018 Board of Trustees meeting. To cover spending in the meantime, the College will ask the Board to consider approving Resolution 18-06-94, Extension of 2017-18 Operating Budget, until the new Budget is completed and approved.

Highlights of the budget:

- There will not be any faculty/staff cutbacks this year due to budget.
- The budget will cover COLAs 3 percent on July 1, 2018, and .7 percent on January 1, 2019.
- Based on estimates for the state allocation and the 2.2 percent tuition increase, a few positions will be added.


Chair Pritchard reconvened the Regular Meeting at 5:05 p.m. and asked if there were any action items as a result of Executive Session. There were none.

This budget document, submitted to the Board of Trustees for their consideration represents the 2018-2019 budget for the State General Operating Fund, Self Support, Student Activities, Parking, Childcare Center, Conference Services and the Northwest Career and Technical High School.

In approving this budget, the Board of Trustees authorizes the transfer from the unobligated fund balance in the General Fund, or other funds, to eliminate any cash deficit as required by RCW 43.88.260, to provide working capital and to support approved projects and activities.

The budgets being submitted in this document will be updated and reported to the Board of Trustees on a quarterly basis. Reports will include:

- * Allocation amendments received from the State Board of Community and Technical Colleges
- * Distribution of income and expenses appropriated by the legislature
- * Unanticipated budgetary changes resulting from executive orders and/or other policy and operational changes





ENROLLMENT REPORT SUMMER 2018




ENROLLMENT TREND | 2017-18





