

How to contact your legislator: A Guide for CPTC Employees

The following methods may be used to express your opinion to legislators about a pending bill or other issue:

- 1. Send a personal letter mail or fax
- 2. Send an email from your personal email address from your home computer
- 3. Call the legislative hotline (800-562-6000). You can leave a short message for up to 3 legislators. Messages are delivered immediately.

THINGS TO REMEMBER:

- 1. You have the most impact with the legislator who represents the district in which you live. They care about your views. They spend a lot of time working on issues of concern to local taxpayers.
- 2. Keep your communication short and to the point. Keep letters to one page directly stating which bill or issues you want them to support and why.
- 3. State Employees:
 - a. Cannot use state equipment to send email to legislators advocating a legislative position. (You can use your home computer and email address to send it.)
 - b. Cannot use state-owned telephones to call the Legislative Hotline with a message for legislators. (You can use your own phone or call from home)
 - c. Cannot use state-owned fax machines, copiers, etc. to advocate a position with legislators.
