Introduction

The Bachelor of Applied Science in Operations Management program at Clover Park Technical College has admission requirements beyond those necessary for general admission to the college. The admission criteria include your academic record, personal characteristics, and potential to work in the Manufacturing Operations or Operations Management fields.

Applicants are generally admitted for a spring or fall quarter start, although students may be admitted in other quarters subject to the availability of spaces and at the discretion of program faculty.

Please follow all directions in this application carefully. Failure to comply with the process described in this document may result in disqualification from the admissions pool for this program.

Admission Requirements and Selection Criteria

Academic Requirements for Admission to the Program

Admission to the program may occur when the following can be documented:

- Successful completion of an earned Applied Associate degree, AAS-T, Direct Transfer Associate degree or equivalent from an accredited institution in an appropriate manufacturing, management or operations-related field with an overall minimum 2.3 GPA in all college-level coursework.
- Intermediate Algebra or higher (minimum 2.3 GPA); or equivalent COMPASS math scores (within the past 2 years).
- 5 college-level credits in English Composition (ENGL& 101 or higher).
- 5 college-level credits in a Social Science.

A minimum grade of 2.3 is required in all college-level coursework.

Academic Requirements for Admission to the Upper Division (Junior Year)

Once admitted to the program, the following must be documented before you can move on to the junior year of the program:

- 5 credits of MATH& 146 or higher-level statistics class
- 5 credits of a college-level math class other than MATH& 146 with Intermediate Algebra as a prerequisite – MATH& 141 Precalculus I or above preferred.
- 5 college-level credits in a Humanities subject – a speech class recommended
- 5 college-level credits in a Natural Science with a lab component – PHYS& 114, ENV&S 101 or CHEM& 121 recommended.

A minimum grade of 2.3 is required in all college-level coursework. These requirements can be satisfied by coursework completed before admission to the BAS program, or during a “bridge” quarter included within the BAS program. The bridge quarter can include up to 20 credits as required.

If you have not completed all of these requirements, you must submit a plan detailing which classes you still need and where and when you will take them. This is documented on Part 1 of the Applicant Self-Reporting Form.

IMPORTANT – You must submit this information at the time of application.

If this is not submitted, your admissions pack will not be considered.

Other Admission Requirements

In addition to meeting the requirements listed on the previous page, you must also submit:

1. Official copies of your transcripts for all of the colleges you have attended.
2. A current resume.
3. A two-page, double-spaced essay describing your interest in the degree, how completion of this degree meets your personal education and employment goals, and any other information that may support your admission to this program.

Applicant Essay Questions

The application essay is a key part of the selection process. Essays should exhibit effective communication skills consistent with work in Manufacturing Operations or Operations Management. Essay question responses are evaluated on content, clarity of message, grammar and spelling.

Essay Questions:

1. Describe your interest in the degree.
2. How does completion of this degree meet your personal education and employment goals?
3. What other information may support your admission to this program?

Your responses to the essay questions must:

- Be typed.
- Address all parts of each question.
- Be double-spaced between the lines.

Your answers to all three questions should not exceed two pages in total.

Selection Criteria

Applicants will be selected by an admissions committee review based on the points assigned to each application element listed below.
