

PROCEDURE

Faculty will develop program policies that adhere to College, State and industry standards. It is understood that industry standards may be more restrictive than college standards and may supersede College standards. These policies will be developed with input from:

- Program Dean,
- Student Success,
- Office of EDI,
- Advisory committee.

Expectations should be written in clear, understandable language and provided to students on or before the first day of class. Any changes to course policies will be dated and provided in writing to all current students. These policies could include, but are not limited to:

- Academic expectations. To include grading policies.
- Attendance and tardiness. Faculty will generate a clear plan to identify make-up hours for students who miss time due to Absence for Faith or Conscience (WAC 357-31-052).
- Policy on late or missing work.
- Classroom, lab or site behaviors.
- Participation in course activities.
- Safety of self, fellow students and clients.
- Industry expectations and standards, including dress code,
- Types of infractions that would follow progressive guidance, and types of infractions considered egregious that may result in failure of the course or dismissal from program

Program policies will be reviewed during scheduled program reviews or earlier as needed.
