Confidential location, emergency shelter for individuals and families fleeing intimate partner violence. Survivor or child(ren) or perpetrator must be enrolled in a federally recognized tribe. Age limit for male children is 12. No pets.

KING COUNTY

Broadview Emergency Shelter/Transitional Housing: (206) 299-2500

Seattle. Female and female identifying survivors with children fleeing intimate partner violence, must have children w/them or within 2 weeks of giving birth. Age limit for males is 18 and still in high school. Allows service animals.

Kent. Confidential Shelter for female and female identifying survivors, single or with children fleeing intimate partner violence. Age limit for male kids is 18. Allows pets.

Seattle. Confidential Shelter for individuals and families escaping intimate partner violence. Both male and female victims. Allows service animals only.

Confidential shelter for female and female identifying individuals and families who are experiencing intimate partner violence. Age limit for male children is 17. Accepts Pets.

THURSTON COUNTY

Olympia. Confidential shelter for both female and male survivors as individuals or with families actively fleeing intimate partner violence. Accepts service animals only.

KITSAP COUNTY

Bremerton. Confidential shelter for female and female identifying survivors, single or with children fleeing intimate partner violence. Age limit for male kids is 17. No pets.

MASON COUNTY

Shelton. Female and female identifying survivors, single or with children fleeing intimate partner violence. No age limit for male kids. Pets allowed but need shot records showing vaccinated (can provide support to get pets vaccinated). Survivors can stay up to 90 days.

Chehalis. Confidential shelter for female and female identifying survivors, single or with children fleeing intimate partner violence. Age limit for male kids is 18. Service animals only.

Homeless Shelters, Availability varies

Nativity House (253) 502-1915, 702 S 14th St, Tacoma, WA

Day Shelter: Open from 7am to 4:30pm. Open to any adults in need of homeless services, food, clothing, hygiene products, mental health services and counseling.

Night Shelter: 4:30pm-7am Available to single adult men and women. To enter the shelter, a guest must check in on a waiting list between 4:30 pm and 7 pm daily. Getting on the waiting list does not guaranteed shelter that night. The guest must check in every day or every other day; if a guest misses check in two days in a row, their name will be taken off the waiting list. Accepts Service Animals and Emotional Support Animals with documentation. Animal must be well behaved and cared for.

The TRM has two separate shelter campuses, the downtown location for men's campus, the Adam's St Women and Family campus

1. Men's Emergency Shelter 425 S Tacoma Way, Tacoma, WA 98402

Men's campus emergency shelter for single men, sign up every day 3:30-6pm for new clients to sign up. Services include: hot meals, access to case manager, showers, laundry services, hygiene products. Must be offsite from 8:30am-3:30pm. Allows pets.

2. Adams St. Family Campus-Women and Family Shelter 2909 S Adams St, Tacoma 98409

Single women or women with kids under 18. Call MWF 8:00am-10:00am to see if there's available room. No walk-ins accepted. Can stay all day and night, 3 meals a day and access to case manager, showers, laundry services and hygiene products. Service Animals only.

3. Clothing Room 425 S Tacoma Way

Open M,W,F 1:30-4pm TRM offer clothing and other living essentials.

KING COUNTY

King county Coordinated Entry for All (206) 328-5900

Eligible if you are homeless, fleeing or attempting to flee domestic violence, or exiting an institution in which you stayed under 90days. You are not eligible if you have already signed a lease. When calling be prepared to leave a voice mail with your name spelled out, date of birth, phone number, and stating what you need assistance with.

Angeline's Day Center is located in Belltown and serves women who are experiencing homelessness with dignity and respect. Our drop-in services include: Breakfast and lunch service, access to bathrooms, showers, and laundry, personal storage lockers, health care access, and referrals to community services.

Overnight shelter is offered in the winter to single adult women. Referrals from service agencies are accepted nightly from 6 - 9 p.m. and self-referrals are accepted after 9 p.m., based on available bed space.
