Type: Full time days Monday through Friday. Clinical rotations could be 6-12 hour shifts anytime from 5 am to 11 pm and up to 50 miles away from CPTC Lakewood campus.

Length: 4 quarters

Number of students admitted a year: 40 in the fall, winter, and spring quarters

Prerequisites:

Must achieve a 2.0 or better and only if required for the prerequisites below that require a B or better:

- CHEM&110 or higher (5CR)
- BIOL&160 or 175 (5CR)

Must achieve a B or better:

- BIOL& 241 Human A & P I w/lab (5CR)
- BIOL& 242 Human A & P II w/lab (5CR)
- BIOL& 260 Microbiology with lab (5CR)
- ENGL& 101 English Composition OR ENGL& 235 Technical Writing (5CR)
- MAT 099 Intermediate Algebra (5CR) or MATH& 141, 146, or 151
- NUTR& 101 Nutrition (5CR)
- PSYC& 100DIV General Psychology (5CR)
- PSYC& 200 Lifespan Psychology (developmental psychology) (5CR)

Must achieve a passing grade.

- COLL 102 College Success (3CR) (not required if you are transferring in 30 credits, have a similar course from another college, or you hold a degree from another college)

NLN PAX Admission exam: with a score of 102 or higher. Unlimited attempts to obtain this score and no expiration for this test. This test is offered in the

- Current American Heart Association Basic Life Support for Healthcare Provider card. The American Red Cross CPR card will not be accepted.
- No Record On File for disqualifying crimes on Washington State Patrol and DSHS background check
- Possibility of drug screening for clinical sites.
- All immunizations must be completed by 1st day of the quarter you start

Nursing Assistant Certificate: 9 credits

Open Registration: Yes online

Type: day classes

Schedule: Orientation is the first day of the quarter, classroom instruction Tuesday through Thursday from 8 am to 2:30 pm for (10 days), lab skills are either Monday & Tuesday or Wednesday & Thursday, Clinical Rotations are for 5 consecutive days from 6 am to 2:30 pm at the clinical site and returning to the lab for 3 days, testing and quarter final.

Length: 1 quarter

Number of students admitted per quarter: 40 each quarter

Immunizations Required for Nursing Programs

Measles, Mumps & Rubella (MMR)

There must be documentation of one of the following:

- 2 doses of vaccinations
- Proof of immunity by titer of each of the three components -Rubella, Mumps & Measles (lab report required)

Varicella (Chicken Pox)

There must be documentation of one of the following:

- 2 doses of vaccinations OR
- Positive antibody titer (lab report required)

Hepatitis B

There must be documentation of **BOTH** of the following:

- 3 vaccinations **AND**
- Positive antibody titer (lab report required)

TB Skin Test (2 Step)

There must be documentation of one of the following:

- Negative 2 step test (2 separate tests done 1-3 weeks apart) within the past 12 months
- Past negative 2 step test PLUS all subsequent annuals (latest test must have been done within the past 12 months)
- If positive results, clear Chest X-Ray report within the past 3 years and submit an annual symptom-free report from your healthcare provider

Tetanus, Diphtheria & Pertussis (Tdap)

There must be documentation of a Tdap vaccination. If the Tdap vaccine was administered more than 10 years ago, you must also submit a recent TD booster.

Influenza

Submit documentation of a flu shot administered after October 1st of the current flu season.
